Antidepressants:

At this time antidepressants are not permitted by the FAA. If medications are no longer required, then an airman may be considered for certification.

Remember it is not only medication that disqualifies a pilot and the diagnosis and situation must be looked at on an individual basis by the FAA prior to issuance of a medical certificate.

Initial report to the FAA

1. Please provide a current status letter from the treating physician to include:
Diagnosis, medical treatment of depression or anxiety (including names and dosages of meds, as well as how long treatment was provided), history of the illness and if any hospitalization was required.
2. Prognosis
3. must be off meds for at least 3 months and have no evidence of recurrence of symptoms to be considered for certification
